
#### MAY'S SPEAKER

In May, the First Edition Book Club read The Help by Kathryn Stockett. The story revolves around Eugenia "Skeeter" Phelan who returns to Jackson, Mississippi fresh from college with a diploma and longing to become a writer. During one of the monthly bridge games that Skeeter enjoys with her friends Hilly Holbrook and Elizabeth Leefolt, Hilly joked about making sure that all the white residents of Jackson have separate bathrooms outside of their homes for the black help. That comment sets off Skeeter and Hilly's battle of wills throughout the novel. A wise Abileen Clark and sassy Minny Jackson are black maids who are enlisted by Skeeter, along with several more maids, to help write a manuscript about their experiences as the Help. There are several relationships woven throughout the story that are too numerous to describe. However the risky undertaking of writing the story about the Help and the humorous activities that take place make this entertaining book a must read. The book was rated 4.5 out of 5
