Ripley's Aquarium Friday, May 23, 2014



First Edition Book Club

Our group read <u>The Dovekeepers</u> by Alice Hoffman. The novel, a historical fiction, is divided into four principal parts, each narrated by four main female characters who have found refuge at Masada and depict the lives and beliefs of women in 70 C.E. The main characters are: **Yael**, an assassin's daughter whose father cannot forgive her for her birth, which killed her mother; **Revka**, a woman whose happy life as a baker's wife is shattered by the destruction of her village; **Aziza**, who was raised as a boy by a warrior stepfather; and **Shirah**, whose

practice of magic is both sought after and feared. The perspective of each woman depicts the fears, the determination and resilience of these women as they navigate through a life rife with danger. The setting takes place during ancient Roman times and is based on the true story of the Roman war against the Jewish stronghold that claimed the lives of 900 rebels and their families.

The group rated the novel a 3.5. Several members enjoyed it while others would not recommend it.
