


MEMBERSHIP:

HAPPY BOOKERS:




THE BOOKIES:

We read <u>Lion</u> by Saroo Brierley. Lion is a remarkable true story of a five year old boy who got lost in India and was not able to return to his family until twenty five years later. Saroo and his family lived hand-to-mouth in a poor village in India when one day he went with his brother Guddu to the Burhanpur train station where his brother was looking for work. Saroo first fell asleep in the station and then went looking for his brother on a train. He was not able to get off the train until it reached Calcutta more than a day later. Thus began a long period of survival on the streets of Calcutta and many frightening adventures.

He eventually was adopted by a loving, supportive couple in Hobart Tasmania in Australia. After about twenty years he began an intensive search for his birth family in India with the help of friends, Google Earth and Facebook. Through perseverance, determination and luck Saroo was finally able to make the trip to India in 2012 to meet with his family.
