
"I Survived the Winter 2013/2014"

MARCH'S MEETING



Marilyn Ruse introduced Colin Dobell re "Stop the Drop Campaign". Colin Dobell is Founder and executive Director of the Water Level Alliance, the non-profit behind "THE STOP THE DROP CAMPAIGN." Collin gave us a power point presentation on the declining levels of the great lakes. He gave us three scenarios about the causes and effects of the declining levels. These were possibly global warming, lack of precipitation, and maybe drainage downstream. Colin demonstrated that Lakes Huron, Michigan, and Georgian Bay are 36CM below long term averages. The main point that Colin is trying get across is that all levels of government cannot agree what the mean cause is, and how to fix it. This campaign started off with 0 concerned citizens, and has grown to approx. 21,300. They are trying to recruit as many citizens as they can, and have a common voice in getting the message out to all levels of government. To sum up they encourage the Great Lakes Public to engage in lake-oriented issues.




First Edition Book Club


The Massey Murder: A Maid, Her Master and the Trial that **Shocked a Country** is a non-fiction work by social historian Charlotte Gray. On February 8, 1915 Charles Albert (Bert) Massey was returning home. As he approached his verandah, the family's maid, eighteen year old Carrie Davies, opened the door and fatally shot him. That Bert was a member of the prominent Massey family (Massey farm machinery) and there was a hint of sexual scandal meant Toronto's newspapers, particularly the Evening Telegram and the Toronto Star, reported widely on the case.

Gray's narrative is rooted in the historical record which is sadly incomplete. No transcript of the trial exists; there are only newspaper accounts. Carrie left no diaries or letters; little is known of her. As a result, some members found the book to be incomplete and Gray's style to be rather choppy. Reaction to the

Omens is the first instalment in Kelly Armstrong's new Cainesville series. She introduces Olivia. Taylor Jones, a twenty four year old from a wealthy family, with an excellent education, and engaged to a CEO of a tech firm. Olivia's world is shattered when she learns that she is adopted and her real parents are serial killers, serving life sentences.

She runs to the small town called Cainsville which is an old cloistered community whose inhabitants take a particular interest in both Olivia and her efforts to uncover her birth parent's past. Aided by her mother's former lawyer, Gabriel, Olivia focuses on trying to prove her parent's innocence. There are darker secrets behind her new home, and powers lurking in the shadows that have their own plans for her.

Not everyone enjoyed the book and no one enjoyed the ending. Not recommended unless you read the other book for the ending.
