

The Happy Bookers Club reviewed <u>Lake of Dreams</u>, by Kim Edwards. Set in modern times, it is a story about Lucy, a young woman returning to her hometown after many years away and still haunted by the unresolved death of her father. She discovers a collection of curiosities which tempt her to unearth discoveries, from another century, about her family's past and its powerful and progressive women. By novel's end, Lucy's discoveries will change her life forever. This is the second novel by the author of <u>The Memory Keepers Daughter</u>. Although still quite a good read, we all decided that her first attempt was much better.

First Edition Book Club

(Last month's review is included here. It was too late to submit in the March issue) In February, the First Edition Book Club read Isaac's Storm by Erik Larson. The book blends science and history to tell the amazing story of the massive hurricane that slammed into Galveston, Texas on September 8, 1900. By the time the water and winds subsided, entire streets had disappeared and as many as 10,000 were dead - making this the worst natural disaster in America's history. Eric Larson describes the storm in horrific detail and follows individuals throughout the fateful day and the storm's aftermath. Some members found the story difficult to get into but for those who persevered, it was well worth the effort. The book was rated 4 out of 5.

In March, the First Edition Book Club read Shanghai Girls by Lisa See. The novel is a fresh, fascinating adventure about two sisters, two cultures, and the struggle to find a new life in America while bound to the old life in China. May and Pearl, two sisters living in Shanghai in the mid-1930s, are beautiful, sophisticated, and spoiled but their family is on the verge of bankruptcy. Hoping to improve their social standing, the parents arrange for their daughters to marry two brothers "Gold Mountain Men", who have come from Los Angeles to find brides. When the sisters decide to revolt, the Japanese invasion of Shanghai puts an end to any of their plans. The sisters leave China and arrive at Angel's Island where they are detained, interrogated, and humiliated for months. When Pearl and May finally meet their spouses in LA, they will still have many trials to overcome. The sister's love for one another is very strong and they make a pact that no one can ever know. The book was rated 4 out of 5.
