
Happy Bookers Book Club

At age 39 he's never had a second date so embarks upon his Wife Project, a 16 page questionnaire to find the perfect partner.

Then ... in walks Rosie.

There are many laughs in this novel, while at the same time it gives us serious reflection and insights into high spectrum autism, and our need for identity, companionship and love.

We would recommend this book and rate it 3.5.

The ROMEO MEN'S Breakfast group gathers on the last Wednesday of each month for fellowship, and




breakfast. In October we met for breakfast and conversation at Mosley Street Grill.

FIRST EDITION BOOK CLUB

We read <u>A Year In Provence</u> by Peter Mayle This is a novel about a British couple who vacationed in Provence, France for a number of years and then decided to purchase a 200 year old dilapidated farmhouse, pull up roots and move there. The entire novel is written in chapters, month by month, on the trials and tribulations of dealing with trades' people through massive construction problems, meeting and living with the local neighbours, while trying to assimilate within the new culture and community. All this in addition to coping with the unruly weather. We had mixed reviews on this book, those who liked it enjoyed it for the easy read, the amusing, if not frustrating, situations experienced throughout the year, picturing ourselves taking on this challenge. There is not much dialogue but the story is descriptive and flows easily. If you love food you will be envious over the multi- courses they partake of while getting to know the neighbours, and wonder how the French manage to



spend numerous hours consuming so much food. On the other side of the review, were those who commented there were far too many descriptions of food items, as well as too many construction woes and not enough character development to keep them interested. It was also mentioned that they felt the couple in question treated the local people they encountered not as their equal, but inferior. This novel rated as: 3.75
